#### **FACT SHEET**

**Location:** Sun City Summerlin is located on Lake Mead Boulevard off U.S. Highway 95 North, approximately eight miles northwest of downtown Las Vegas. Sun City Summerlin is part of Summerlin, Howard Hughes Properties' 25,000-acre master-planned community.

Size: Sun City Summerlin comprises 1,050 acres, with a projected population of 5,900 people.

**The Homes:** Approximately 3,100 homes will be built. The 13 models start at \$83,900. Sun City Summerlin offers three types of homes:

 Single Family Homes: These are homes in which the owner provides landscaping and maintains the home. There are no additional fees.

• Garden Villas: For a projected monthly fee of \$85, the villa owner receives water and sewer services, garbage collection, building insurance, landscaping and exterior maintenance.

\* • Duplexes: For a projected monthly fee of \$97, the duplex owner receives water and sewer services, garbage collection, building insurance, landscaping and exterior maintenance.

Golf Fees: An 18-hole, par 72, championship golf course will play at 5,670 to 6,790 yards and includes multiple tee placements accommodating all skill levels.

Option 1: Just pay as you play. Owners will enjoy discounted green fees.

Option 2: Purchase an annual membership and enjoy golf for the reduced

green fee of \$1 per 9 holes of golf. (Cart not included.)

**Recreation Center:** The Mountain Shadows Recreation Center will include tennis, shuffleboard, bocci, racquetball, billiards, olympic-size outdoor pool (with handicapped ramp and hoist), indoor therapy pool (with handicapped ramp and hoist), nine-hole miniature golf course, multi-purpose auditorium, jogging track, par exercise circuit, exercise room, and Arts and Crafts Village. The fee is \$250 per home, per year.

**Commercial:** Fifty acres have been set aside for commercial development including retail stores, banks, medical offices, and financial and legal services. Neighborhood and regional shopping areas are within 10 minutes of the community.


**Medical:** A major hospital is within 15 minutes of the community. Las Vegas has10 hospitals and numerous clinics providing excellent care.

**Religious:** Four worship centers are located in the community and Las Vegas has more worship centers per capita than most major cities.

Scores of civic-minded Sun City residents donated their time, talent and possessions to help two worthy causes during the final months of 1989.



# Mountain Shadows Site of Seniors Tennis Tournament


The Mountain Shadows Community Center was one of five Las Vegas sites selected for a national tournament of the U.S. Seniors Tennis Association November 17-19.

# California Couple Buys 1000th Home

A California couple searching for a second home in Southern Nevada made a bit of building history recently by buying the 1000th home to be sold in Sun City Las Vegas.

"We traveled around Las Vegas for two-and-half days looking at new housing projects before we looked at Sun City," recalls Richard Clancy.

"We threw away about ten brochures from the other places once we found it."

Richard and his wife, Colleen, purchased the 1,196-square-foot Franklin, one of 13 models offered at Sun City. The two bedroom, two bath, condo-style Garden Villa home features a covered patio, separate kitchen and dining areas and a 1 1/2-car garage.

The structural quality of the house was one of its big selling points. "I'm a doctor," says Richard, "but everybody has to have a hobby and mine happens to be construction. I know what R-30 insulation is and R-19 insulation, and I appreciate things like double-pane windows."

"Everything about it was so much nicer than anything else we saw that it struck us immediately that this is what we'd buy," says Colleen. "I think what I most liked here was the overall picture — the golf course and the tennis courts and the quality of the community in general."

There are a lot of key players in Sun City's development team. One of the most important is Kim Bannister, Vice President of Construction Operations at Sun City Las Vegas.


A 1971 graduate of Arizona State University, Bannister started his construction career with Del Webb in Phoenix after leaving college.
